# Introduction

This completion guide helps candidates in local elections in British Columbia properly complete and file the candidate disclosure statement with Elections BC following a local election, in accordance with the requirements of the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act* (the Act). This guide should be used together with the disclosure statement forms.

For detailed information regarding rules specific to candidates and elector organizations, see the Guide to Local Elections Campaign Financing in B.C.

## Disclaimer

Elections BC's guides are intended as an aid to understanding the Act. How the Act applies to any particular case will depend on the individual circumstances of the case and may change in light of new legislation and judicial developments. If there is any inconsistency between this guide and the Act, the Act will prevail.

# Important terms

## **Anonymous contribution**

A contribution made by an individual or organization whose identity is unknown to the candidate and financial agent. An individual cannot request that a contribution be accepted and disclosed as an anonymous contribution if they are known to the candidate or financial agent.

## **Campaign contribution**

The amount of money, or the value of any non-monetary property or services, provided without compensation to a candidate or elector organization for campaign use.

## **Disclosure statement**

A campaign financing report that discloses contributions, expenses and other information related to a candidate's or elector organization's campaign.

## **Election proceedings period**

The period that begins on the 46<sup>th</sup> day before General Voting Day and ends at the close of voting on General Voting Day.

## **Fundraising function**

Includes a social function held by, or on behalf of, a candidate or elector organization for the purpose of obtaining funds.

## **Identifiable contribution**

Any campaign contribution that is not anonymous. All identifiable contributions must have the following information recorded:

- (a) date and value of the contribution,
- (b) full name, mailing address and class of the contributor, and
- (c) full name and mailing address of two directors for class 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 contributors.

## **Intended election expense**

Goods or services acquired for campaign use but not used.

## **Jurisdiction**

The applicable jurisdiction in which a general local election, by-election or assent voting is held.

**Market value**

The lowest price charged for an equivalent amount of equivalent property or services in the market area at the relevant time. Market value includes all applicable taxes.

**Significant contributor**

In relation to campaign contributions, an individual or organization who:

- (a) made a campaign contribution having a value of \$100 or more, or
- (b) made multiple campaign contributions to the same candidate or elector organization such that the total value of the campaign contributions to that candidate or elector organization is \$100 or more.

**Supplementary report**

A report that updates Elections BC of changed, added or corrected information in a disclosure statement. It includes a description of the circumstances leading to the supplementary report. Supplementary reports are also called amendments.

**Transfers**

Movements of money, goods or services between a candidate's campaign accounts, an elector organization's campaign accounts or between an elector organization and its endorsed candidates.



# Disclosure statement filing details

## Who must file a disclosure statement

Each individual who was declared to be a candidate must file a campaign financing disclosure statement with Elections BC. Candidates running in more than one election must file a separate disclosure statement for each election.

A candidate must file a disclosure statement even if they were acclaimed or withdrew from the election, did not incur any election expenses or were declared by a court to no longer be a candidate.

All applicable forms must be completed. A listing of all forms is found on form 4220, the cover page to the disclosure statement. A candidate who did not receive any campaign contributions or incur any election expenses must still complete forms 4220, 4221 and 4222.

## When and how to file a disclosure statement

The filing deadline for disclosure statements is 90 days after General Voting Day. Elections BC will contact you if no disclosure statement is received by the filing deadline. Disclosure statements filed between 90 and 120 days after General Voting Day are late and must include a \$500 late filing fee.

It is an offence to not file a disclosure statement by the 120 day late filing deadline unless a court has granted you relief. There are significant penalties for committing an offence.

Candidate disclosure statements must be:

- filed by the financial agent for the candidate (or by the candidate if they are acting as their own financial agent)
- received by Elections BC or a Service BC Centre by 4:30 p.m. (Pacific time) on the day the report is due; a postmark is not acceptable as proof of delivery by the deadline
- submitted on forms provided by Elections BC ([elections.bc.ca/lecfa/candidates](https://elections.bc.ca/lecfa/candidates))
- submitted by email, fax or mail using the contact information located on the [last page](#) of this guide or by hand to the Elections BC office in Victoria or a Service BC Centre ([servicebc.gov.bc.ca/locations](https://servicebc.gov.bc.ca/locations))

**General instructions for all forms:**

- Submit all relevant forms. If there is doubt whether a form should be submitted, contact our office for clarification.
- Complete the forms online or print neatly in block letters with a pen.
- Complete the detailed forms first, then carry forward the totals to the summary forms.
- Enter the candidate's full name on each page.
- Enter dates as YYYY/MM/DD – e.g., for November 15, 2014, enter 2014/11/15.
- Number the pages, for forms that have more than one page, using the boxes in the top right corner of the forms – e.g., Page 1 of 2, Page 2 of 2, etc.

**What happens after filing a disclosure statement**

Elections BC will contact the candidate's financial agent to ensure that all requirements under the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act* are met and to discuss any issues that require clarification.

Keep a copy of the disclosure statement for your records. You may need to use the information to file amendments or to respond to questions from Elections BC.

The candidate must retain their disclosure statement records and supporting materials in British Columbia for five years after General Voting Day.

**Privacy notice**

Elections BC has the authority to collect, use, disclose and dispose of personal information under the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act* and the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*. This information is used to administer local elections campaign financing provisions.

# **Local elections candidate disclosure statement forms**

## 4220 – Campaign Financing Disclosure Statement

This cover page must accompany all disclosure statements filed, including amendments (supplementary reports) submitted after the original statement. Please ensure that each relevant field is completed.

- 1 Enter the full name of the candidate and (if different) their ballot name.
- 2 Enter the date of General Voting Day (YYYY/MM/DD).
- 3 Enter the office sought by the candidate.
- 4 Enter the candidate's mailing address, phone number and (if available) email address.
- 5 Enter the jurisdiction where the candidate sought office and (if applicable) the electoral area, local trust area or trustee electoral area.
- 6 If the candidate was endorsed by an elector organization, enter its ballot and legal names.
- 7 Unless the candidate acted as their own financial agent, enter the full name, mailing address, phone number and (if available) email address of the financial agent. Elections BC needs this information in order to notify the financial agent of the status of the submitted disclosure statement. We will send all correspondence to this address. Note that this form is available for public inspection, so you may choose to list an office address and phone number instead of your residential information.
- 8 Enter the date the financial agent was appointed. If other individuals previously acted as financial agents in relation to this election, provide their information on form 4236.
- 9 Tick this box if the candidate acted as their own financial agent.
- 10 Tick this box if the candidate was also registered with Elections BC as a third party sponsor. A separate disclosure statement must be filed in relation to third party advertising conducted independently of a candidate's campaign.
- 11 This is a listing of all the forms which must be submitted to Elections BC as part of the disclosure statement. Use it as a checklist to identify which forms are applicable and have been completed. If submitting an amendment, check only those forms that have been revised.
- 12 If this is the first version of the disclosure statement, leave the "Amendment # \_\_\_\_" blank. If this disclosure statement amends a previously submitted one, enter the number of the amendment (or supplementary report) here. For example, if this was the second disclosure statement to be submitted, it would be the first amendment and "1" would be entered in this space.

- 2 The declaration must be signed and dated by the financial agent. Enter the financial agent's full name in the box below the signature. If the candidate acted as their own financial agent, only one signature is required.
- 3 Enter the name and address of each savings institution in which the candidate had a campaign account for this jurisdiction. For multiple accounts at the same institution, only enter the information once.

Complete this form last as the fields depend on information from other forms. If total income and total expenditures are zero, indicate this in the appropriate fields.

- 1 Enter the total value of campaign contributions received from all sources, as reported in box C of form 4223.
- 2 Enter the total value of transfers received from the elector organization, as reported in box A of form 4226.
- 3 Enter the total value of other permissible deposits into the campaign accounts, as reported in box A of form 4227.
- 4 Enter the total value of transfers received from the candidate's own campaign accounts in other jurisdictions, as reported in box A of form 4233.
- 5 Add the above four values and enter the total income of the campaign into box A.
- 6 Enter the total value of election expenses, as reported in box A of form 4229.
- 7 Enter the total value of transfers given to the elector organization, as reported in box A of form 4230.
- 8 Enter the total value of other permissible payments from the campaign accounts, as reported in box A of form 4231.

## 4223 – Summary of Campaign Contributions by Class

This form summarizes all campaign contributions the candidate received in relation to their campaign in a particular jurisdiction.

- 1 Enter the total value of identifiable contributions received from each class of contributor (e.g., for individuals, enter the total value of all contributions received from individuals, including contributions of less than \$100). Contributions of goods and services must be recorded at their current market value.
- 2 Enter the total value of identifiable contributions received into box A.
- 3 Enter the total value of permissible anonymous contributions received into box B. An anonymous contribution greater than \$50 is a prohibited contribution, which is disclosed on form 4225.
- 4 Enter the total value of all campaign contributions received into box C. This total must equal the sum of boxes A and B.
- 5 Enter the total amount of significant contributions received. This amount must equal the sum of all boxes A on forms 4224 – Significant Contributors (\$100 or More).
- 6 Enter the total value of identifiable contributions received from donors who gave less than \$100 total. Do not include the value of anonymous contributions received.
- 7 Enter the total number of identifiable contributors who gave less than \$100. Do not include the number of anonymous contributions received.
- 8 Enter the total number of anonymous contributors who made anonymous contributions.

## 4224 – Significant Contributors (\$100 or More)

This form is used to disclose all contributors who made one or more campaign contributions to the candidate that total \$100 or more. Contributions of goods and services must be recorded at their current market value. Use additional pages of this form if necessary.

Note that the disclosure requirements under the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act* vary for contributors depending on their class. For contributors other than individuals, the mailing address of the contributor and the names of two directors or principal officers must be disclosed.

### Classes of contributor:

- 1 – Individual
- 2 – Corporation
- 3 – Unincorporated business/commercial organization
- 4 – Trade union
- 5 – Non-profit organization
- 6 – Other identifiable contributor

- 1 Enter the date each separate contribution was received. If a single contributor made multiple contributions on different dates, list each of the separate contribution dates. Please group multiple contributions from the same contributor together.
- 2 Enter the full name of the contributor. If the contributor is a class 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6 contributor, provide the full names of two directors. If the contributor is a sole proprietor, indicate this after the name of the director. If the contributor is a union, provide the full name and (if applicable) the local number. Initials are not acceptable.
- 3 Enter the mailing address of the contributor for class 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6 contributors. If the contributor is an individual, leave this field blank or mark it "N/A."
- 4 Enter the class of the contributor. For a complete list, see the classes listed at the bottom left corner of the form or above on this page.
- 5 Enter the value of each separate contribution. If a single contributor made multiple contributions on different dates, the value of each separate contribution must be listed.
- 6 Enter the total value of all significant contributions in box A. Ensure this total is carried forward to form 4223 – Summary of Campaign Contributions by Class.

## 4225 – Prohibited Campaign Contributions

This form is used to report any contributions which were received but are prohibited under the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act*. This includes anonymous contributions over \$50, any non-anonymous contributions missing required contributor information and indirect contributions. Complete one form for each prohibited contribution received.

The Act requires the candidate to return prohibited contributions, or an amount equal to the value of the contribution, to the contributor within 30 days of becoming aware of the contravention. If this is not possible, the contribution, or an amount equal to its value, must be remitted to Elections BC as soon as practicable for payment into the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

- 1 Indicate whether the prohibited contribution was received from an individual, an organization or anonymously by ticking the appropriate box.
- 2 Enter the date the prohibited contribution was received (YYYY/MM/DD).
